Dr. Funmi Olonisakin is Director of the Conflict, Security and Development Group (CSDG) at King's College London. In this role she established the CSDG Knowledge Building and Mentoring Programme that comprises the Peace and Security Fellowships for African Women and the CSDG/ECOWAS MA Studentship and Mentoring programme. She has recently initiated the African Leadership Centre which aims to build the next generation of African scholars and analysts in the field of peace, security and development.

Prior to this, she worked in the office of the United Nations' Special Representative of the Secretary General for Children and Armed Conflict. She is a member of the international advisory board of the Geneva Centre for Democratic Control of Armed Forces (DCAF) and an Associate Fellow of the Geneva Centre for Security Policy (GCSP). She also serves on the international advisory board of the Norwegian Foreign Ministry's Training for Peace (TfP) programme.

Olonisakin has written extensively on international peace and security issues with a special focus on Africa. The following books are among her most recent publications: 'Reinventing Peacekeeping in Africa' (Kluwer, 2000), 'Peacekeeping in Sierra Leone: The Story of UNAMSIL' (Lynne Rienner, 2007), 'Global Development and Human Security', co-authored (Transaction, 2007), and most recently co-editor of 'Challenges of Security Sector Governance in West Africa' (Lit Verlag, 2008). She is an active member of the African Security Sector Network (ASSN).
